Those applying for the Brelage Scholarship are the only applicants to use the application marked "Brelage Scholarship".

Due to IRS regulations, no family members or members of the selection committee of the respective scholarships may apply for their own scholarships.

The Sylvester J. “Bess” Bartling Memorial Scholarship



Upon the urging of his former students, family members of Sylvester J. “Bess” Bartling established a scholarship in 2005 to honor his memory. A long-time resident of Batesville, Bess Bartling retired from teaching music at all levels in the Batesville Community Schools in 1972 after nearly forty years. He also directed the Eureka Band for 57 of his 63 years as a member, and directed the St. Anthony Choir at Morris and later the St. Louis Choir at Batesville for many years.

The Doris A. Brelage Nursing Scholarship



This scholarship was established by the family of Doris Brelage in her memory following her untimely death. A registered nurse and EMS member, she spent 37 years at Margaret Mary Community Hospital as director of nursing, head of surgical nursing and director of infection.

To qualify for the scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must be a graduate of Batesville High School or a nominee from a practicing nurse at Margaret Mary Community Hospital.
- Must have been admitted to an accredited nursing school, or be an LPN going on in a RN program to an accredited nursing school.
- Must be preparing to begin his or her clinicals.
- Must complete the attached RCCF scholarship application.
- Must submit a written recommendation from a RN practicing at Margaret Mary Hospital. This recommendation may not be written by a member of the selection committee or family member of the selection committee.
- Must demonstrate proven dedication to community service.
- Must demonstrate excellent people skills.
- Must have a 2.8 or above GPA in college courses.
- Must provide an official transcript from his or her college and/or school of nursing.

The George & Patricia Brinkmoeller Scholarship



The Brinkmoellers have supported the Ripley County Community Foundation from its inception in 1997. George was a member of the Founding Board and later served as the Board President. In 1997, the couple started a fund to support the Batesville Food Pantry. This scholarship was started by them in 2007 to help further the education of Batesville High School and Oldenburg Academy graduates.

Scholarship Details

- Dollar amount of the scholarship will be determined by the annual distribution of the fund.
- The Principal (or designee) of Batesville High School, the principal (or designee) of Oldenburg Academy, and a Brinkmoeller family member (or other representative) will be responsible for making a recommendation to the RCCF Scholarship Committee.
- Recipients of this scholarship are only eligible one time unless there are no other applicants in a given year.
- The scholarship will be announced on awards night at the respective schools.

Criteria

The applicant must:

- Be a graduate from Batesville High School or Oldenburg Academy
- Plan on majoring in education
- Be in the upper 25% of graduating class
- Submit a copy of his/her high school transcript
- Submit an essay on why teaching is his/her choice of study
- Plan to attend an accredited four year Indiana college or university

Scholarship Details

- The value of the scholarship each year and the number of recipients will depend on the value of the distribution of the endowment fund.
- Recipients are eligible only one time
- Funds will be made payable to the school of the recipient's choice

Criteria

- A graduating senior from South Ripley High School will be the recipient each year of the Ebinger Memorial Scholarship.
- The student shall be selected using these requirements. (These requirements are prioritized):
 - Plan to study in the field of diesel mechanics.
 - FFA member at South Ripley High School and seeking higher education in any field.
 - 4-H member at South Ripley High School and seeking higher education in any field.
- Applicants must:
 - Complete the attached application
 - Include a photograph of themselves with the application
 - Submit a written essay, 500 words or less, telling about themselves, their future plans and interests
 - Provide a written personal recommendation from a teacher, coach, pastor, employer, etc.
 - Applications must be received by March 1. The scholarship will be awarded during the honors convocation at South Ripley High School.

The Friends of Milan Wrestling Scholarship

The Milan Wrestling program is a unique and special program that has a positive effect on the lives of those who participate. This scholarship encourages students who have been a part of the wrestling team to further their education in their chosen field.

Scholarship Details

- Fund provides one-time scholarship for eligible wrestlers and/or mat maids
- The Milan High School wrestling alumni will be responsible for making a recommendation to the RCCF Scholarship Committee. Volunteers serve for one year only.
- Amount of scholarship shall be determined by the annual distribution made from the fund
- Scholarship will be awarded annually unless there is a year in which no eligible candidates apply
- Award will be made on Senior Night at Milan High School

Criteria

Scholarship Details

- The scholarship will be funded by the annual distribution allocated by the Ripley County Community Foundation, Inc.
- Recipients are eligible one time
- Funds will be paid directly to the college or university the recipient is planning to attend
- The Batesville High School Principal, the Margaret Mary Community Hospital Vice-President of Nursing and the Principal of Oldenburg Academy will be responsible for making recommendations to the RCCF Scholarship Committee

Criteria

Applicant must:

- Be a graduating senior from Batesville High School, any other Ripley County high school, or Oldenburg Academy
- Be planning a major in an accredited nursing program (limited to RN students)
- Be in the upper 25% of graduating class
- Be in real need of funds to pay tuition for college
- Include a copy of his/her high school transcript
- Include a copy of acceptance letter from your college or university
- Include a letter of a recommendation from a high school teacher or guidance counselor
- Include a photograph of self with application
- Submit an essay no more than one page stating why this scholarship will help him/her.

- Demonstrate financial need, after all other scholarships, grants and awards are considered
- Be the first generation in family to attend college or university
- Be interest in entering the field of education

The William H. (Gus) and Mary Margaret Moorhead Scholarships



Two scholarships are given in memory of William H. (Gus) Moorhead and in honor of Mary Margaret Moorhead-the Moorhead Student Athlete Scholarship and the Moorhead Print Media Scholarship. Mr. Moorhead was the first basketball coach and then principal at South Ripley High School for 23 years. Mrs. Moorhead taught journalism and speech at South Ripley for 25 years, serving as advisor for the school newspaper for 25 years and the school yearbook for 12 years. Both Mr. and Mrs. Moorhead continued their work with print media after retirement from SRHS at the end of the 1991 school year. Employed by Ripley publishing Company from 1991-2006, Mr. Moorhead wrote sports columns and Mrs. Moorhead was a staff writer. The Moorhead Student Athlete Scholarship honors a member of the South Ripley graduating class who has excelled in athletics, scholarship, leadership and attendance; the Moorhead Print Media Scholarship benefits a graduating member of the *Raiders Riot* staff at SRHS.

Scholarship Details

The scholarships

- Will benefit two members of the graduating class of South Ripley High School or its township schools
- Are both one-time scholarships
- Amounts are determined by the monies distributed by the fund
- The Senior High School principal, the *Raiders Riot* advisor, the Athletic Director and a member of the Moorhead family will make recommendations to the RCCF Scholarship Committee
- Awards will be presented at the annual Honors Night program.

Criteria for Print Media Scholarship
